SUPERBA HEATSET MACHINES: KEY ITEMS TO CHECK ON EVERY SHIFT

- Look for steam/water leaks to prevent water on the floor that could cause a slip hazard.
- Check yarn paths for missing ceramics or grooved areas where yarn rubs to prevent fiber breakage or fraying.
- Inspect stainless steel belting for bent or damaged areas that could hang the fiber as it is being taken up on the winder.
- Check the yarn control system at the exit of the Superba for worn or cracked areas on the fiberglass/lexan tightening unit. Damage or wear in this area could cause processing problems and bad fiber.

ICBT/VERDOL TWISTERS: IMPORTANT THINGS TO CHECK ON EVERY SHIFT

- Check head ends for oil leaks and frayed belts
- Check yarn paths for missing ceramics and locked down bearings. These areas can cause off quality fiber and poor running conditions.
- Check spindle areas for yarn chokes/wraps. This can cause off quality and poor running conditions.

NEED TO CONVERT A STANDARD SUPERBA 9 METER TUNNEL FROM WIDE COUNTERBAND TO TIE-DOWN TAPE? Here is what you need:

To convert from counterband to 9/16" tie-down tape (3 straps), you would need one (1) roll of EE102800 9/16" Nomex Tie-Down Tape (240 yards each) and 12 EE102820 Rollers.

To convert from counterband to 3" tie-down tape (1 strap), you would need one (1) roll of EE102804 3" Tie-Down Tape (100 yards) and 4 EE102822 Rollers.

TENSION CAPSULE BASICS

There are two basic types of capsules, manual and air.

The manual style capsule is used in both the protection pot (in the multiple tension device) and in the overhead creel (in the double or single tension device). The manual capsule requires a nylon threader to thread the yarn through the tension device.

The air style capsule is used in the protection pot for twisters that have air threading capabilities. The design of the capsule allows it to be suspended when the air has been activated to pull the yarn through the air tension device.

ARE YOU PRACTICING FIFO (FIRST IN-FIRST OUT) ON YOUR INVENTORY?

Just like bread, certain materials have a shelf life, including some of your spare parts.

Parts made of rubber, EpiMark markers, urethane parts, wood, grease, oil, and other such materials will degrade over time, especially if not stored in a cool, dry, dark place, away from any sunlight or ultraviolet light.



It is also human nature to want to save some safety stock of important parts on the side, just in case it is needed for emergencies. Where trouble might be found is when the safety stock of spare parts are never used, and they are also made from one of these degradable materials. It is good practice to always use your parts first-in, first out, even the ones in your secret hiding place.
